Members & guests were welcomed. A total of 30 people were in attendance.

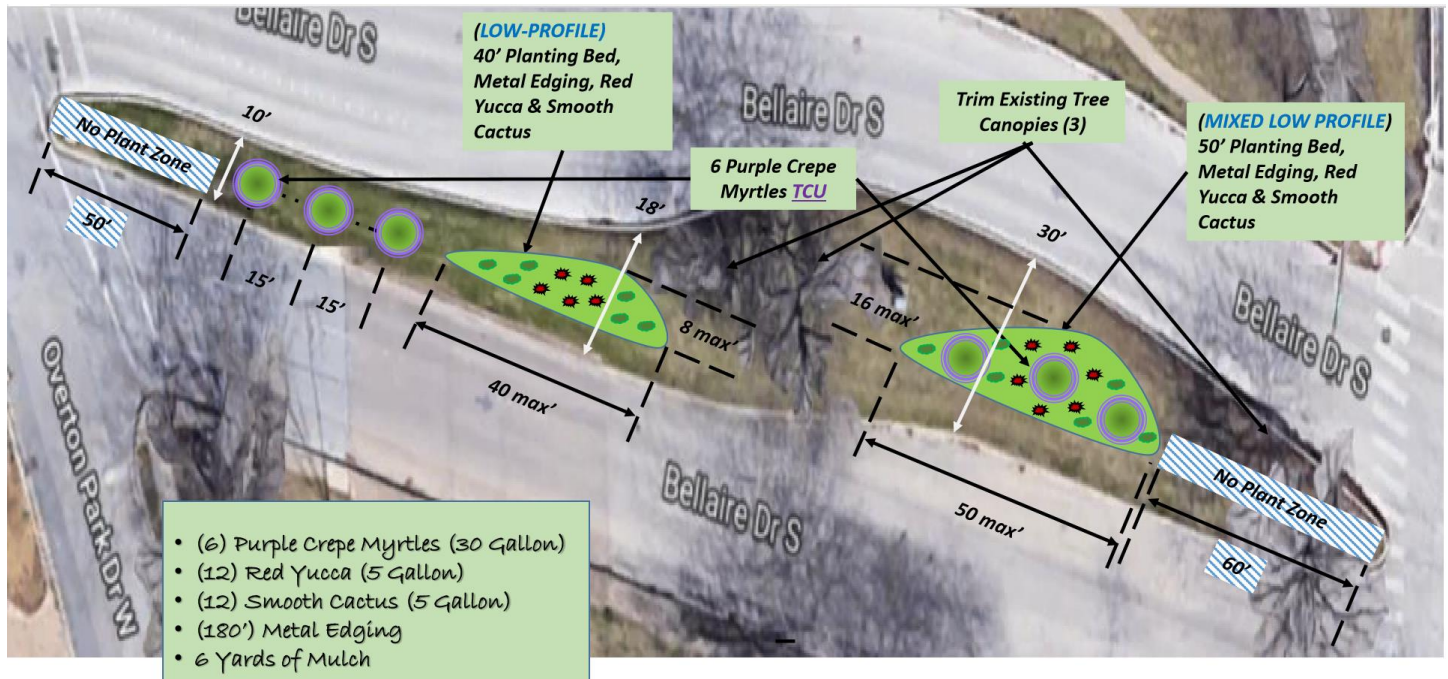

Minutes from our 2019 FALL General Meeting were approved with one revision.

Treasurer's Report was submitted and reviewed. As of February, there is a balance of \$20,219 in the OPNA treasury.

Joanne Viola thanked those who have contributed already to the 2020 OPNA membership drive. Over 900 membership letters and invoices were mailed in April to all OPNA residences.

Bob Dellamura presented the Bellaire Drive median beautification that was approved by the City Parks & TPW in December 2019. The OPNA is planning to install the beautification in the median between Overton Park Drive East & West in the Fall or next Spring.



Bob Dellamura presented the proposed OPNA By-Law updates which consolidated and reduced a number of committee positions and added the media of Teleconferencing as an option for conducting Board & General meetings.

Joanne Viola reported that Atmos Energy work is complete on Ranch View, but that funding for water and street replacement is pending at this time. OPNA will continue to follow-up with the City regarding this project's progress.

Joanne Viola has requested maintenance of the existing split-rail fences in Overton Park. The OPNA has offered to partner with the City to repair the fencing to enhance safety and appearance.
