- Minutes from our Fall 2016 Meeting were approved.
- There was approximately 92 people in attendance.

 - Continued Hulen St Median upkeep

 - 4th of July Parade with Marching Band
 - The New NextDoor Crime Watch Signs appear effective
 - Proposed New Street Lighting on Overton Park Dr E.
- The Mayor/Council Dist3/ Water Board Election is May 6th – Kal Silverberg gave a report.
- Christy Jones from the Camp-Fire introduced the summer program.
 - June 5th thru August 11th

- Councilman Zim Zimmerman spoke about the road construction. Overton Park East (Bellaire to Altura Ct) & Ranchview Rd will be repaved in the fall of 2017.

- Tanglewood Elementary School is a big issue. Zim is here to assist with anything that he can.
- NPOfficer Laura Charlesworth indicated that the COPs (Citizens Patrol) program is vital to reducing crime and she and our NPO are here to help. There will be training available in June.
 - The COPs Program is a Formal Program that directly connects Volunteer crime watchers with police.
 - The NextDoor signs are a 24/7 awareness for those that may be thinking of committing a crime, that we are a connected and watchful neighborhood.
- David Motheral, from the Overton Park NA & Cara Kennemer, from the Tanglewood NA, described the situation with the Tanglewood Elementary school. ~900 now verses 500 that the school is made for.
